A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Some of my favorite moments in the theatre are with new work. As the third theatre company to get to produce Eleanor Burgess's play *Wife of a Salesman*, I am honored to be bringing this new play to Columbus.

This is a play for the women who came before us, the women of the present, and the women who will come after us. Embracing the complexities of the evolving ideas of what it means to be a woman, *Wife of a Salesman* asks us to think about the expectations placed on us both historically and in the present. What are the ideas we put on ourselves and others about work? About marriage? About motherhood? How do the choices we make change how we are perceived? What choices do we have to make?

I spent a lot of time with Arthur Miller's work – especially *Death* of a Salesman – as a young woman. Arthur Miller's writing shaped the American Theatre. They gave my younger self the opportunity to witness some incredible performances – but always with a man as the protagonist and women in his orbit. How exciting to be reexamining his characters from a new perspective. Who are the women in *Death of a Salesman* really? What would they say to each other if they had a chance?

The conversations in *Wife of a Salesman* are refreshingly honest, surprising, and complex. They make me think of my grandmothers, my mom, my aunts, my cousins, my teachers, my friends – so many women who have their stories to tell and who have made it possible for me to tell mine.

I hope you connect with the characters in this story like I have. May we continue to tell the stories left behind so they are not forgotten.
