#### **CATCO, CATCO Is Kids Announce 2018-19 Seasons**

# Highlights include collaborations, Harlem Renaissance celebration, seven-show season at CATCO is Kids

COLUMBUS – CATCO will open its 2018-19 season Sept. 7-16, 2018, with *Eubie!*, a contribution to central Ohio's celebration of the Harlem Renaissance, as well as a salute to famous jazz/swing musician Eubie Blake, featuring 12 songs from the landmark 1921 production of *Shuffle Along*.

"What better way to recognize the profound impact the Harlem Renaissance had nationwide and in Columbus than with the music revue *Eubie!*," said Steven C. Anderson, CATCO producing director. In conjunction with *Eubie!*, CATCO is also creating a digital oral history project, collecting stories and photos of Columbus' African-American community during the Harlem Renaissance, to celebrate the centennial recognition of this historic landmark.

"Collaboration with other artists and arts groups continues to define CATCO and CATCO is Kids, and next season we are thrilled to continue our collaboration trend," said Joe Bishara, CATCO associate producing director. CATCO will co-produce *Breaking the Code* with Evolution Theatre Company Oct. 24-Nov. 18, 2018, the acclaimed drama about mathematical genius Alan Turing, a pioneer in the field of computers and computer science, and a brilliant code-breaker work during World War II. His work saved countless lives.

In addition, CATCO is Kids will co-produce *Haroun and the Sea of Stories*, a captivating work of fantasy based on Salman Rushdie's classic children's novel of the same name, with Columbus School for Girls May 3-12, 2019. The regional premiere features magicians and fantastical talking animals encountered by Haroun on his adventure to restore the sea of stories.

CATCO and CATCO is Kids will join forces during the holidays to present *The Christmas Schooner* Nov. 28-Dec. 16, 2018, a heartwarming musical for families and kids of all ages about the crew of a Great Lakes schooner that risks everything to bring the Christmas spirit to German immigrants in Chicago who are homesick for their motherland during the late 19<sup>th</sup> Century.

CATCO will open 2019 with *Every Brilliant Thing*, Jan. 23-Feb. 10, 2019, a moving drama about a son who tries to make sense of his mother's chronic depression. Processing his sadness – and fear of the onset of his own mental illness – leads him to make a list of the greatest things the world has to offer.

A contemporary spin on Chekhov's *Uncle Vanya* will be presented March 20-April 7, 2019, featuring a group of individuals exploring life's most perplexing questions and pondering whether life really does suck. CATCO will end the season May 29-June 16, 2019, with *Pacific Overtures*, a musical by Stephen Sondheim. It's 1853 and Japan is haltingly taking steps to open its ports to competing western powers.

*Pacific Overtures*, which will be interpreted through the lens of the Japanese Kabuki theatre, tells the story about a country trying to maintain integrity in the face of westernization.

Another highlight on the CATCO is Kids season is an expansion to seven shows all featuring youth performers, Bishara said. The 2018-19 season kicks off Aug. 17-19, 2018, with *Madagascar A Musical Adventure Jr.* based on the blockbuster DreamWorks film. Get ready to "Move It, Move It!"

Other shows on the CATCO is Kids season include *The Lion King Experience KIDS* Nov. 10-11, 2018, Disney's beloved *Lion King* story in a production perfect for young theatergoers. Coming next, Jan. 11-20, 2019, is *Sunshine*, a musical play based on the book *Sunshine* by Ludwig Bemelmans and a regional premiere. A grumpy landlord's life changes when he meets a special music teacher and her students.

Based on the beloved book by Dick King-Smith, *Babe, The Sheep Pig* will be presented March 1-10, 2019. Babe charms her way to success at the Grand Challenge Sheep Dog Trials in this tale of farmyard adventure. Favorite Dr. Suess characters come to life on stage in *Suessical KIDS* March 23-24, 2019, another musical production designed specifically for young theatergoers.
