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CATCO Presents Every Brilliant Thing Jan. 23-Feb. 10

British tour de force an exploration of hope, finding joy in life

A young man tries to boost his mother's spirits as she suffers from mental illness. Fear of the onset of his own chronic depression and processing his sadness leads him to make a list of a hundred, then a thousand, then a million of the greatest things the world has to offer.

This one-character tour de force called *Every Brilliant Thing*, which will leave audiences with a deeper understanding of joy, will be presented Jan. 23-Feb.10, 2019, at CATCO. All performances will be at the Studio Two Theatre, Vern Riffe Center, 77 S. High St.

"This solo piece forces us to take a break for a bit from our busy day-to-day routines to think about what makes it great to be alive, and, in the process, makes us both laugh and cry," said Steven C. Anderson, CATCO's producing director and the director of *Every Brilliant Thing*, which features New York City's Timothy Elliott (*Buyer & Cellar* and *An Act of God*) as the narrator.

Every Brilliant Thing, an intimate, 70-minute theatre experience, premiered in June 2013 at the Ludlow Fringe Festival, a collaboration between Duncan Macmillan, George Perrin and Jonny Donahoe, a stand-up comedian, who originally performed the role of the narrator. It made its North American debut in December 2014 at the Barrow Street Theatre in New York City. The theatre adaptation, more than a decade in the making, came from a short story, *Sleeve Notes*, written by playwright Macmillan. It was made into an HBO movie in 2016.

"Every Brilliant Thing ... takes the chill off the depths of a light-starved winter," says *The New York Times.* "Makes for thrilling and deeply intimate theatre ... one of the best plays of the year," says *NOW Toronto Magazine.*

Elliott is a New York city-based actor, who was last seen at CATCO performing in *An Act of God* during the 2016-17 season. Before that he performed in *Buyer & Cellar*. Other credits include performing in the world premiere of *Marvelous: An Illuminated Tale* for the New York City Fringe Festival and appearing as Sir Isaac Newton in the *Physicists* for Lonesome George Productions, and Kirk in *Tiny Bubbles* for New Directions. He essayed the role of the Narrator in Craig Wright's *The Pavilion*, where he played no less than 17 different characters.

Anderson's directing credits include plays as diverse as the central Ohio premiere and first nontouring production in Ohio of *Fun Home*, as well as *Eubie!*, *Aspects of Love*, *Educating Rita*, world premiere of *Henry Ford's Model E*, *I Do! I Do!*, *Gross Indecency: The Three Trials of Oscar Wilde*, *An Act of God*, *Mothers and Sons*, *Peter and the Starcatcher*, *The Elephant Man*, *Avenue Q*, and the highly acclaimed production of Doug Wright's I Am My Own Wife. He has also directed *Candide* and *Hair* at The Ohio State University Theatre Department; *Love! Velour! Compassion!* and *The Taste of Sunrise* at CATCO; *Big River* and *Pippin* at Actors Theatre; *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum* at New Harmony Theatre; and *Greater Tuna*, *Little Shop of Horrors*, and *Assassins* at the former Players Theatre Columbus where he served as Associate Producing Director.
