CATCO is Kids Presents Regional Premiere of James and the Giant Peach JR. Aug. 26-Sept. 4

27 central Ohio youths perform in Roald Dahl's classic

CATCO is Kids will open its 2016-17 season with a regional premiere and new musical, *James and the Giant Peach JR.*, adapted from one of Roald Dahl's most poignantly quirky stories, Aug. 26-Sept. 4, 2016, at the Shedd Theatre, Columbus Performing Arts Center, 549 Franklin Avenue. The show will feature 27 central Ohio youths.

James and the Giant Peach JR., by Benj Pasek and Justin Paul, features the tale of James, who is sent by his conniving aunts to chop down their old fruit tree. Afterward, he discovers a magic potion that grows a tremendous peach, which rolls into the ocean and launches a journey of enormous proportions.

"We're excited to open our season with the regional premiere of the musical *James and the Giant Peach JR*., a musical that contain morals and life lessons that children and even adults can appreciate," said Joe Bishara, CATCO associate producing director and director of *James and the Giant Peach JR*. "While the show highlights themes of abandonment, abuse and redemptive reward with justice meted out appropriately to all, the primary theme is the importance of overcoming one's fears."
