CATCO Launches 2014-15 Cabaret Season with Forever Plaid

Boy group singing '50s standards in four-part harmony opens Sept. 25

In the golden age of the 1950s boy groups, four young, eager singers are killed in a car crash on the way to their first big concert. Beginning Sept. 25 in CATCO's Studio Three Theatre, they are miraculously revived for the posthumous chance to fulfill their dreams and perform the show that never was.

They exude charm and melodic delight with numbers, such as *Love is a Many Splendored Thing*, *Three Coins in the Fountain* and *Moments to Remember*. Think Jersey Boys meets Under the Streetlamp.

"Audiences will delight in this boy group singing '50s standards in four-part harmony," said Steven C. Anderson, CATCO producing director. "CATCO first performed this musical in the 1990s, and we are excited to bring it back as we celebrate our 30th year. Fans of our cabaret musicals won't want to miss this show."

Forever Plaid will be performed in the intimate Studio Three Theatre at the Vern Riffe Center, 77 S. High St. Tickets are \$35. A limited number of reserved tables are available for \$180 (four seats). Students may purchase tickets for \$15 two hours before any performance based on availability and valid I.D.

Starring as CATCO's Plaids are Ben Hartwig (Smudge), an acting apprentice at CATCO last year, whose acting credits include *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer* at CATCO is Kids, and Imagine Productions' *Chicago* and *Urinetown;* and William Macke (Jinx), a recent graduate of the Hartt School, whose acting credits include *The Crucible, A Christmas Carol* and *Twelfth Night* (Hartford Stage), *Princesses: A Rock Musical* (Staged Reading, Goodspeed Opera House), and 1776, *Wait Until Dark* and *Cabaret* (Monomoy Theater).

They are joined by Zachary M. Pytel (Frankie), a student at Capital University, whose credits include *Les Miserables* (Jean Valjean), *The Last Five Years* (Jamie), and *Next to Normal* (Gabe); and Cody Shope (Sparky), a former acting apprentice at CATCO, who has performed in CATCO is Kids' productions of *Beauty and the Beast* and *The House at Pooh Corner*, CATCO's production of *Avenue Q*, and SRO's production of *Chess*.

Matt Clemens, who recently appeared as Lawrence in CATCO's season opener, *Dirty Rotten Scoundrels*, is the director and music director. He has served as the music director at CATCO for *Always...Patsy Cline, The Story of My Life, Avenue Q* and *Five Guys Named Moe* and performed in *A Christmas Carol.*
