CATCO is Kids Opens season with Shakespeare and Star Wars: Verily, A New Hope Aug. 25-27

Retelling of Star Wars in the style of the immortal Bard of Avon made possible by PNC Arts Alive

Return once more to a galaxy far, far away with this sublime retelling of *Star Wars* in the style of the immortal Bard of Avon at CATCO is Kids' 2017-18 season opener, *Shakespeare and Star Wars: Verily, A New Hope*, Aug. 25-27. The play, written by Ian Doescher and featuring a cast of 26, 23 of them local youth actors, is made possible by PNC Arts Alive.

CATCO is Kids' presentation, full of all the adventure, valor and villainy of Shakespeare's greatest plays, is the sage of a wise (Jedi) knight, an evil (Sith) lord, a beautiful princess held captive, as well as a young hero coming of age.

"Imagine what *Star Wars* would be like if William Shakespeare had penned it and you have *Shakespeare* and *Star Wars*: *Verily*, *A New Hope*," said Joe Bishara, CATCO associate producing director and the show director. "CATCO is Kids' audiences who have enjoyed the *Seussification of Romeo and Juliet* and *A Seussified Christmas Carol* won't want to miss this imaginative spin on a classic. *Star Wars* fans won't want to miss it either."

All shows will be performed at the Lincoln Theatre, 769 E. Long St., a different location than the Columbus Performing Arts Center, 549 Franklin Ave., where the majority of CATCO is Kids' shows are performed and classes are held.

Principal actors in *Shakespeare and Star Wars* are:

- Monty Almoro (Han Solo), whose recent roles include an apostle in *Corpus Christi* (Bartholomew) and a brother in *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat* (Judah).
- Jim Azelvandre (Obi-Wan Kenobi), an actor for 35 years and artistic director of MadLab Theatre, who was most recently seen in *The Emperor of the Moon* (Actors Theatre) and *Corpus Christi*

(Evolution Theatre). Other notable performances include roles in The Tempest, Titus Andronicus and Waiting for Godot. He received the 2015 Playwright Fellowship sponsored by CATCO and the Greater Columbus Arts Council.

- Gabriella Cain (Chewbacca), a 14-year-old and ninth-grader at Columbus School for Girls. She
  recently appeared in the CATCO is Kids/Columbus School for Girls co-production of *Anne of Green Gables*.
- Grace Emmenegger-Conrad (Princess Leia), a sophomore at Columbus School for Girls, who has participated in CATCO's Audition Showcase camp for seven years and performed the role of Lady Bug in *James and the Giant Peach Jr*. last summer.
