CATCO Presents Life Sucks. March 20-April 7

Smart comedy/drama adapted (sort of) from Anton Chekhov's Uncle Vanya

A contemporary spin on Chekhov's *Uncle Vanya*, a group of relatives, lovers and eccentrics explores life's most perplexing questions and ponder whether life really does suck in Aaron Posner's fresh smart comedy/drama *Life Sucks*. presented by CATCO March 20-April 7.

"Imagine Woody Allen interpreting the Russian playwright and you will understand a fraction of the hysterical angst," said Steven C. Anderson, CATCO's producing director and director of *Life Sucks.*, which premiered in 2015.

Posner, co-founder of the Arden Theatre Company in Philadelphia, is well-known for his adaptations, including works by William Shakespeare, Anton Chekhov and Chaim Potok. CATCO produced Posner's adaptation of Potok's *My Name is Asher Lev* during the 2014-15 season. "Posner's work, especially when it comes to classics, presents adaptations in a new light. They are creative and cleverly adapted for contemporary audiences," Anderson said.

CATCO will present *Life Sucks* in the Vern Riffe Center, Studio Two Theatre, 77 S. High St.

"Wise, profoundly humane, hilarious, quirky, endearing and, in countless clever ways, brilliantly faithful to its source," said the *Chicago Sun-Times* about *Life Sucks*. "Life sucks, maybe, but watching the Posner play is pure bliss," according to *DCTheatreScene.com*

Performing in *Life Sucks* is a veteran cast of Ohio actors, including some who are new to the CATCO stage. They include Todd Covert (Dr. Aster), who returns to CATCO after appearing in *Dirty Rotten Scoundrels, The Final Table* and *Henry Ford's Model E*. He has appeared in numerous performances with many central Ohio theatres, include Short North Stage and Weathervane Theatre. John Feather (The Professor) has worked on stage, as a voice actor and in regional commercials and industrial films. Credits include *Midsummer Night's Dream* (Nick Bottom), *Big River* (The King), *Hamlet* (Polonius) and *The Sunshine Boys* (Willie Clark). Mary Trapp Gray (Babs) has appeared in *It's A Wonderful Life: A Radio Play, Last Night of Ballyhoo, How I Learned to Drive* and *Taking Sides* at CATCO. Recent roles include Nat in Curtain Players' *Rabbit Hole* and Jean in New Players Theater's *Good People*.

They are joined by Josh Innerst (Vanya), an AudioBook narrator and member of the acting company at the American Shakespeare Center, where he has performed in more than 30

productions including *Hamlet* (Hamlet) and *Julius Caesar* (Brutus). Other credits include *Sherwood: The Adventures of Robin Hood* (Cleveland Play House), and *The 39 Steps* (Bootless Stageworks). Anita McFerran (Ella) is making her CATCO debut. Favorite roles include Shadowbox Live's *Chicago* (Hunyak), *American Idiot* (Heather) and *Scrooge* (Isabel); Mad Lab's *Kitezh* (Lily); and Imagine Productions' *The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas* (Doatsey Mae). Vanessa Sawson (Pickles) performed in CATCO's play reading of *Skinny* last summer. Originally from Michigan, Sawson has performed with The Purple Rose Theatre (*Diva Royale*), Tipping Point Theatre (*Ripcord*) and Williamston Theatre (*Beau Jest*). Kelly Strand (Sonia) has performed in *Steel Magnolias* and *What the Butler Saw* at CATCO. Favorite recent credits include *Angels in America* at Ensemble Theatre of Cleveland, *Salvage* at None Too Fragile Theatre, and *A Fox on the Fairway* at Highlands Playhouse.

Anderson's directing credits include plays as diverse as the central Ohio premiere and first nontouring production in Ohio of Fun Home, as well as Every Brilliant Thing, Eubie!, Aspects of Love, Educating Rita, world premiere of Henry Ford's Model E, I Do! I Do!, Gross Indecency: The Three Trials of Oscar Wilde, An Act of God, Mothers and Sons, Peter and the Starcatcher, The Elephant Man, Avenue Q, and the highly acclaimed production of Doug Wright's I Am My Own Wife. He has also directed Candide and Hair at The Ohio State University Theatre Department; Love! Velour! Compassion! and The Taste of Sunrise at CATCO; Big River and Pippin at Actors Theatre; A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum at New Harmony Theatre; and Greater Tuna, Little Shop of Horrors, and Assassins at the former Players Theatre Columbus where he served as Associate Producing Director.
