CATCO Presents Play Reading of The Price of Power by Herb Brown Feb. 7-8

Drama focuses on President John F. Kennedy, Robert F. Kennedy, J. Edgar Hoover

CATCO will present a reading of a new riveting drama written by former Ohio Supreme Court Justice and Columbus playwright Herb Brown called *The Price of Power*. The play reading, which will be presented at CATCO Friday and Saturday, Feb. 7-8, 8 p.m., focuses on the relationships between former President John F. Kennedy, his brother, Robert F. Kennedy, and J. Edgar Hoover, and revelations about their elaborate schemes as they all grapple for power.

The early 1960s were a turbulent time in American history. Newly elected President John F. Kennedy ushered in a promise of hope. His younger brother Bobby was entrusted as Attorney General and their administration faced the Bay of Pigs, the beginnings of Viet Nam, Civil Rights and many, many more challenges. Their nemesis was J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, who kept dossiers on the mistakes of every prominent politician, including John F. Kennedy's extramarital affairs, in America in order to consolidate his own power.

"Kennedy was a charismatic and visionary leader who nonetheless suffered from an inability to avoid extramarital sexual dalliances. Hoover, seeing information about these multiple trysts as an opportunity to exert 'guidance' on the young president, found himself in a cat-and-mouse game that never provided him with the satisfaction to which he aspired," according to Steven C. Anderson, CATCO producing director and director of *The Price of Power*.

"Herb's knowledge of history and the human foibles that make it enticing and unforgettable are abundantly evident in this 'never before heard' reading of his fascinating play."

Brown has written seven plays, three of them world premieres produced by CATCO: You're My Boy in 2005; The Final Table in 2015; and Henry Ford's Model E in 2017. The Power of God was featured in CATCO's Shorts Festival 2002. He is also working on an eighth play, The Duchess. His novels include Shadow of Doubt and Presumption of Guilt. Presumption rose to No. 10 on the Doubleday national bestseller list and Shadow was a selection of the Literary Guild.

Brown's plays stem from an interest in bringing intriguing history to life on the stage. No matter the era, you can discover a contemporary hook in almost all of it, he said in a recent interview.

"History certainly does repeat itself, although the repetition comes with different personages (characters) and somewhat different manifestations."

There will be a brief question-and-answer session with the playwright and actors after the reading.

Play reading actors are:

- Kevin Carty (John F. Kennedy, president), who performed in CATCO's recent production of *Holmes and Watson*. Previous CATCO credits include *The Final Table, I Love You You're Perfect Now Change, The Fantastics*, as well as *Seussical the Musical* and *You're a Good Man Charlie Brown* at CATCO is Kids. He has directed shows at CATCO is Kids, Reality Theater, Columbus Children's Theatre, Opera Columbus, and several area high schools, and, for the last 10 years, has portrayed the role of the clown wearing Big Red Shoes.
- Todd Covert (Clyde Tolson, assistant director of the FBI), who holds a BFA from The Ohio State University and an MFA from The University of Southern California. At CATCO, he has performed in *Life Sucks.*, *Dirty Rotten Scoundrels*, *The Final Table*, and *Henry Ford's Model E*. Short North Stage credits include *Saturday Night Fever*, *Kiss of the Spider Woman*, *A Normal Heart*, *Angels in America*, *Dream Girls* and *Assassins*; Weathervane Theatre credits include *The Odd Couple*, *Meet Me in St.Louis*, *The Full Monty* and *Gypsy*.
- Isaac Nippert (Robert F. Kennedy, attorney general), who performed in CATCO's production of *My Name is Asher Lev* during the 2014-15 season. His Los Angeles theater credits include *A Christmas Carol* and *Nothing Sacred* at South Coast Repertory, *Don Juan* at A Noise Within and *The Magic Bullet Theory* at Sacred Fools Theatre Company.
- Ralph Scott (J. Edgar Hoover, director of the FBI), who is a graduate of The Second City in Chicago and has performed in *Holmes and Watson, Breaking the Code, The Realistic Joneses, Ken Ludwig's Baskerville: A Sherlock Holmes Mystery, The Three Trials Of Oscar Wilde, The Final Table, Next Fall, Bengal Tiger at the Baghdad Zoo, My Name Is Asher Lev, Evie's Waltz, The Foursome and The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee at CATCO.* In addition to numerous regional and national commercial works, Scott is active in independent movies locally and throughout the Midwest.

Directing the play reading is Steven Anderson. Anderson's directing credits include plays as diverse as the central Ohio premiere and first non-touring production in Ohio of Fun Home, as well as Application Pending, Home, My Way, A Musical Tribute to Frank Sinatra, Holmes and Watson, Life Sucks, Every Brilliant Thing, The Three Trials of Oscar Wilde, Peter and the Starcatcher, Avenue Q, and the highly acclaimed production of Doug Wright's I Am My Own Wife. He has also directed Candide and Hair at The Ohio State University Theatre Department; Love! Velour! Compassion! and The Taste of Sunrise at CATCO; Big River and Pippin at Actors Theatre; A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum at New Harmony Theatre; and Greater Tuna, Little Shop of Horrors, and Assassins at the former Players Theatre Columbus

where he served as Associate Producing Director.
