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
We seek to inspire a community of empathy and have a responsibility to recognize the ways in which we benefit from colonization, both historical and ongoing. A Land Acknowledgement is a formal statement that recognizes and respects Indigenous Peoples as traditional stewards of this land and celebrates the resilience and strength that all Indigenous people have shown worldwide.

We acknowledge that in Central Ohio, we are on the traditional homelands of the Shawnee, Potawatomi, Delaware, Miami, Peoria, Seneca, Wyandotte, Ojibwe, and Cherokee Indigenous nations who have strong ties to these lands. We recognize generations who contributed their traditions, hopes, and spirit to make the history that led to this moment. While some have lived on this land for more generations than can be counted, others arrived here hoping for a better life, while others were forcibly taken and brought here against their will. Acknowledging the truth of these realities is critical to building mutual respect and connection.



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A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR OF

THE WOLVES

I first read *The Wolves* in a graduate level playwriting class and was instantly a 16-year-old again. No time machines, magical wishes, or fortune cookies about it-this play transformed and transported me with every like, omigosh, and thinly veiled insult. DeLappe's casual, thrumming dialogue covers topics such as break ups, make ups, college prep, and genocide, reminding us that for many teenagers, "it doesn't get easier, you just get better." While the actors onstage are portraying "an elite girls soccer team," it feels important to call-in the current discussion about gender and sports. Every body belongs on stage and on soccer pitches. Including all athletes and actors, regardless of their gender identity, helps us model a tiny sliver of the utopian ideals that our society is capable of achieving. Allowing trans and nonbinary youth to compete on teams that respect their gender identity is a life-saving act, a simple way to demonstrate solidarity, compassion, and the shared human experience that unites us all. When you watch this show and are reminded of the ways that you were once 16, I hope that you depart the theatre with compassion for all the brave people who claim their girlhood on soccer turfs, studio floors, and the hallways of a high school.

Thank you to all the coaches, teachers, and directors I have had the good fortune to learn from, and thank you to the cast and crew; Leda, and CATCO for letting me direct one of my favorite scripts. Thank you to the teen girls: "our most distinguished professors, who teach us to bury the burst until we close our bedroom doors, and then cry with blood in the neck, foot through the door, face in the pillow, the teen girls who teach us to scream."
